## 🕇 Call for Abstracts

There will be a call for abstracts to solicit speakers for six moderated panel discussion sessions (with four to five presentations per session). Two poster sessions, one during Friday evening's welcome reception and one during lunch on Saturday, should ensure ample time to interact with presenters.




