### ★ Call for Abstracts

There will be a call for abstracts to solicit speakers for six **moderated panel discussion sessions** (with four to five presentations per session). The emphasis will be on practical tips and lessons learned that attendees can take home and start implementing in their practices or communities. Whether you are a seasoned community pediatrician or looking to expand your current activities, these sessions will have something for you. The moderated panel discussion sessions focus on specific topic areas and are marked with a ★ on the conference schedule.

The call for abstracts will also solicit **poster presentations**. Posters on a wide range of community, medical home, and collaborative topics will be accepted: from implementing a medical home to training residents in community pediatrics, from addressing health disparities to increasing access to mental health services, from implementing tobacco cessation activities to promoting health literacy. Two poster sessions, one during Friday evening's welcome reception and one during lunch on Saturday, should ensure ample time to interact with presenters.
